The International Group of PME

The International Group for the Psychology of Mathematics Education (PME) is an autonomous body, governed as provided for in the constitution. It is an official subgroup of the International Commission for Mathematical Instruction (ICMI) and came into existence at the Third International Congress on Mathematics Education (ICME3) held in Karlsruhe, Germany in 1976.

The Constitution of PME

The constitution of PME was adopted by the Annual General Meeting on the 17th of August, 1980 and changed by the Annual General Meetings on the 24th of July, 1987, on the 10th of August, 1992, on the 2nd of August, 1994, on the 18th of July, 1997 and on the 14th of July, 2005. We print here only two parts of the constitution. As members it is important that you are aware of your rights. The group has the name "International Group for the Psychology of Mathematics Education", abbreviated to PME. The major goals of the Group are:

- to promote international contact and exchange of scientific information in the field of mathematical education;
- to promote and stimulate interdisciplinary research in the aforesaid area; and
- to further a deeper and more correct understanding of the psychological and other aspects of teaching and learning mathematics and the implications thereof.

Personal presentations

These activities aim at providing the opportunity to individual PME members to present their work and share their ideas with colleagues from over the world. Each participant is allowed to present **only one research report or short oral**, and can appear as co-author at most three times. No one should have his or her name on the programme more than four times (although more than four submissions are possible).

Notifications of decisions of the International Program Committee to accept or reject the proposal

were available by April, 2012. The detailed reviews are available in the ConfTool system website at http://www.conftool.com/pme36/ (author's personal page).

In order for an accepted proposal to appear in the proceedings the presenting author(s) must pay the total Conference fee no later than **May 16th**, **2012**. (The Conference Deposit already paid by the presenting author(s) for the Pre-Registration is NON-REFUNDABLE.)

Research Reports (RR)

Research Reports (RR) should deal with topics related to the major goals of the IGPME. Reports should state what is new in the research, how it builds on past research, and/or how it has developed new directions and pathways. Some level of critique must exist in all papers.

The deadline for the submission of RR proposals was **January 15th**, **2012**. The number of submitted proposals was 224, and 117 were accepted.

Each RR presentation will be allotted a total time of 40 minutes: 20 minutes for the oral presentation and 20 minutes for questions and comments.

Short Oral Communications (SO)

Short Oral Communications were proposed to the International Program Committee via a one-page abstract which will be included in the Proceedings of the Conference if accepted. The deadline for the submission of SO proposals was **March**, 1st, 2012. Proposals were reviewed by the members of the International Program Committee. The number of submitted proposals was 96, and 53 were accepted.

SO Communications will be presented in groups of three. Each individual SO is allocated 10 minutes for the oral presentation and, when all three presentations are completed, a 30 minutes period is devoted to discussion on all three presentations.

Poster Presentations (PP)

Poster Presentations were proposed to the International program Committee by means of a one-page abstract. The deadline for the submission of PP proposals was **March**, **1**st, **2012**. Proposals for PP were reviewed by the members of the IPC. The number of the submitted proposals was 45, and 30 were accepted.

For each PP a Visual Display must be prepared to fit into a maximum of 100 centimeters high by 90 centimeters wide stand in a specific location designated for this purpose.

There is no formal oral presentation associated with Poster Presentations. Posters will be on display in the Poster Area. The schedule will be provided in the conference timetable, during which presenters are expected to be available by their posters for discussion with conference participants.

Group Activities

The aim of the group activities is to achieve the exchange of information and ideas related to the PME.

Conference participants will need to select which sessions they would prefer to attend and indicate this in their registration. Group activities take place during the parallel time allotments, and have limited space.

Research Forums

The goal of a Research Forum is to create dialogue and discussion, by offering PME members more elaborated presentations, reactions, and discussions on topics on which substantial research has been undertaken and which continue to hold the active interest of a large subgroup of PME.

A Research Forum is not supposed to be a collection of presentations, but to convey an overview of an area of research, its main current questions and perspectives.

Two 90-minute slots will be devoted to the Research Forum.

Reviewing Process

The potential reviewers were recruited during the 1st IPC meeting from experienced PME members who had presented either two PME Research Reports in the last five years or presented three PME

Research Reports in the last ten years. Reviewers received proposals for review according to the research categories that they marked in their reviewer information form, using ConfTool system. The proposals were sent to the reviewers according to the research categories marked by the author(s).

Reviewers for Reports of Studies (Empirical Research) were asked to comment on the following: theoretical framework and related literature, methodology (if appropriate), statement and discussion of results, clarity, and relevance to a PME audience. Reviewers for Theoretical and Philosophical Essays were asked to comment on the theoretical framework and related literature, on the articulated statement of the author's position, on implications for existing and further research, and on the relevance to the PME audience.

The reviewing process was completed during the 2nd IPC Meeting, on the end of March 2012. Notifications letters of acceptance/rejection were sent to the author (s) by **April**, **2012**.

Call for Research Forums

Proposals for a Research Forum to be organized at PME 37 in Kiel, Germany, should be in hands of

Pre-Submission Support for PME 37

Pre-Submission Support (formerly known as the Early Bird Procedure) for PME Research Reports and Short Oral Communications offers support to novice and inexperienced researchers on the general basis of strengthening submitted papers in terms of (a) the presentation of the research and structure of the paper, and (b) language.

Please note that this procedure is intended to provide feedback on written reports. It is not meant as support for conducting research. The coordinator of the Pre-Submission Support procedure first asks the authors to apply the formatting guidelines carefully, before assigning the paper to an appropriate mentor, and arranging that communication between the mentor and novice-researcher proceeds smoothly. The mentor is expected to give advice about how to improve the structure of the paper in order to report the research more effectively. No advice is given on the academic content (e.g. choice of related research, methods or results) but the mentor will help with the organization and presentation of the different sections of the report, if necessary.

Although many requests come from people who have studied in English for their doctorate, some need help with their writing. After some prior interaction with the authors, support is given to assist them on language issues by pointing to parts of the text that require rewriting, and in some cases by exemplifying appropriate spelling and grammar. It is not the intention of this procedure, however, to proof read the paper in its entirety, but to point out weak language, and to send recommendations. Once the mentor - in agreement with the coordinator- is of the opinion that enough support has been given, and after having sending comments on a first version of the paper and on a subsequent revision, the procedure will be considered to be completed.

Pre-Submission Support is a service restricted to people who have not had a Research Report accepted before. It does not guarantee acceptance, neither does it take responsibility for final internal coherence and language use. All submitted papers will still undergo the regular PME reviewing procedures.

The Pre-Submission Support coordinator, appointed by the International Committee, is Richard Barwell. Researchers who wish to have a mentor for the PME37 Conference in 2013 should submit

a RR or SO and contact the coordinator at mailto:richard.barwell@uottawa.ca, as early as possible, and no later than September 6th, 2012. Pre-Submission Support papers should be accompanied by a statement in which the authors briefly explain their background, and why they lack access to expert advice.








Map of National Chiang Kai-Shek Memorial Hall:




Venue —Wesley Girl's High School (July 19~22, 2012)

How to reach Wesley Girl's High School






By MRT & Bus



Getting Around Taipei

Taipei City is the capital of Taiwan and the central city of the largest metropolitan area of Taiwan. Taipei is situated at the northern part in Taiwan. Taipei is the political, economic, and cultural center of Taiwan. Considered to be a global city, Taipei is part of a major industrial area. Railways, high speed rail, highways, airports, and bus lines connect Taipei with all parts of the island. The city is served by two airports: Taipei Song-Shan Airport and Taiwan Taoyuan International Airport. Taipei maintains an extensive system of parks, green spaces, and nature preserves. Parks and forestry areas around the city include Yangmingshan National Park, Taipei Zoo and Da-an Forest Park, and so on. Yangmingshan National Park is famous for its cherry blossoms, hot springs, and sulfur deposits. Taipei is also the city containing abundant history and culture. The National Palace Museum which has one of the largest collections of Chinese artifacts and artworks in the world is located in Taipei. Taipei is also known for night markets. The most famous one is the Shilin Night Market in the Shilin District. The surrounding streets by Shilin Night Market are extremely crowded during the evening. Most stores and vendors in night market are usually opened in late afternoon and keep operating until the midnight. In the night market, you can taste delicious and special food, buy inexpensive and stylish clothing, and enjoy in various entertainment. Taipei city is composed of the beautiful nature, abundant cultures and history, high-developed technology, convenient transportation, special customs and humanities. Getting Around Taiwan

Taiwan is also known, especially in the past, as Formosa. Taiwan is an island of East Asia in the western Pacific Ocean and located in the southeastern coast of mainland China. Separated from the Asian continent by the 160 km wide Taiwan Strait, the main island of the group is 394 km long and 144 km wide. The shape of the main island of Taiwan is similar to a sweet potato seen in a south-to-north direction, and therefore, Taiwanese, especially in the point of view of Min-nan division, often call themselves "children of the Sweet Potato." Taiwan's rapid economic growth in the decades after World War II has transformed it into an industrialized developed country and one of the Four Asian Tigers. This economic rise is known as the Taiwan Miracle. It is categorized as an advanced economy by the IMF and as a high-income economy by the World Bank. How to reach Taipei, Taiwan

Taipei City is located at the northern part of Taiwan Island. You can take Mass Rapid Transportation (MRT), that is, the subway system, to travel around Taipei City. MRT provides English services for foreign tourists. You can visit to the other main cities in Taiwan by air, Taiwan Railway, Taiwan High Speed Rail, bus and so on. Taiwan is linked by air to a lot of main cities around the world, such as New York, Frankfurt, Tokyo, Seoul, etc.

By Air

Taipei has its own international airport, *Taiwan Taoyuan Interational Airport (formally called CKS International Airport)*, and flights connect it with other major cities in Taiwan. It also has a domestic airport, *Taipei Song-San Airport*. There are several local flights connecting Taipei to other cities around Taiwan. *Taiwan Taoyuan Interational Airport* is situated 40 kilometers away from the

Taipei City. Shuttles of Taiwan High Speed Rail, coach bus and taxi services are all available at the airport. For further information, please contact http://www.taoyuan-airport.com/chinese/index.jsp

After Arriving at Taiwan Taoyuan Interational Airport, you can TRANSIT to Taipei by the following ways:

By Taxi

For the taxis, the fare from the airport to Taipei City is around TWD 1800 (about 50 €).

By Shuttle Bus

For some hotels, there are shuttles provided from the airport to the hotel. If you stay in the **Taipei Ambassador Hotel** during the conference, you can take the bus, Kuokunag line 1819, to arrive there.

By Couch Bus

There are a lot of bus companies providing services to transit from the airport to Taipei City. You can buy bus tickets from the reception areas of both Terminals 1 & Terminal 2. Ticket Counters in Terminal 1 are located on the southwester side of the Arrival Passenger Reception Area (on the 1st floor). The Bus Platform in Terminal 2 is located at the northeaster side of the Arrival Passenger Reception (on the 1st floor). The fare of one-way shuttling is about 3 to 4 €per adult. It may take about 30-50 minutes from the airport to Taipei City.





Electrical Appliances

Electricity in Taiwan is 110 Volts, alternating at 60 Hertz. In some hotels, there are wall sockets for 220 Volts. If you travel to Taiwan with a device that does not accept 110 Volts at 60 Hertz, you will need a voltage converter.

Time Zone

The time in Taiwan is eight hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT + 8). Same time zone is used all around Taiwan

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Taiwan Telephone Code

To call Taipei, Taiwan, you will need to dial: International Access Code +886 plus area code (the area code of Taipei is "2") and finally dial the correct telephone numbers. For example if you need to have a international call with someone in Taipei, Taiwan and his telephone number is 23639955, you need to dial the number as +886-2-23639955.

Shopping

Most shops in Taiwan are open from 10:00 to 22:00 on Monday to Sunday. Night Markets are open from late afternoon to mid-night. Convenient stores like 7-ELEVEN or FamilyMart are open for 24 hours.

Safety

It is generally safe to walk in the Taipei City and it is usually still busy even after 12:00 at night. However, it is not suggested for anyone to go around Taipei alone after midnight. Please notice departure time of the last train if you need to take MRT. (Please link to http://english.trtc.com.tw/ct.asp?xItem=1056375&CtNode=49781&mp=122032 to check timetable. You can choose the MRT station you desire to get on and check the departure time of the last train.) And then, we suggest you to go with your companies if you need to take a taxi at midnight.
